

APRIL 27, 2016 - REGULAR MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CAMILLUS, COUNTY OF ONONDAGA, STATE OF NEW YORK, HELD AT THE CAMILLUS MUNICIPAL BUILDING.

Supervisor Coogan called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., followed by the Pledge of Allegiance, led by Boy Scout Troop 60.

PUBLIC HEARING #1

Consider amending the Camillus Municipal Code, Chapter 81-Senior Citizens Tax Exemption, §81.4-Annual Application Required, the purpose of which is to allow applications by Senior Citizens to be accepted by the Assessor after the appropriate taxable status date under certain circumstances.

Supervisor Coogan explained that this change only applies in cases of the death of the applicant's spouse, child, parent, brother or sister or in cases of illness of the applicant applicant's spouse, child, parent, brother or sister which prevents the applicant from filing on a timely basis, which must be certified by a licensed physician.

Resolution #82

Councilor Callahan moved to close the public hearing. Councilor Griffo seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Resolution #83

Councilor Callahan moved to amend the Camillus Municipal Code, Chapter 81, §81.4-Annual Application Required, the purpose of which is to allow applications by Senior Citizens to be accepted by the Assessor after the appropriate taxable status date under certain circumstances. Councilor Flood seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

PUBLIC HEARING #2

Consider amending the Camillus Municipal Code, Chapter 50-Solid Waste and Recycling, §50.21-Preparation of Recyclables For Collection, §50.22-Preparation of Garbage, Non-Recyclables, Construction Debris, Major Appliances, and Large Household Furnishings for Collection, §50.23-Removal of Recyclables, Construction Debris, Major Appliances, and Large Household Furnishings to reflect changes due to the new automated tote pick up trash system.

Resolution #84

Councilor Callahan moved to close the public hearing. Councilor Flood seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Resolution #85

Councilor Callahan moved to amend the Camillus Municipal Code, Chapter 50-Solid Waste and Recycling, §50.21-Preparation of Recyclables For Collection, §50.22-Preparation of Garbage, Non-Recyclables, Construction Debris, Major Appliances, and Large Household Furnishings for Collection, §50.23-Removal of Recyclables, Construction Debris, Major Appliances, and Large Household Furnishings to reflect changes due to the new automated tote pick up trash system. Councilor LaFlair seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

PUBLIC HEARING #3

Consider the proposed Technology Law to be titled Chapter 11.

Mr. Oudemool explained that this chapter covers the Town's obligations if it has reason to believe that there may have been a breach in the security of its system and that someone may have obtained another's personal information, and what the Town must do to notify the card holder.

Resolution #86

Councilor Callahan moved to close the public hearing. Councilor LaFlair seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Resolution #87

Councilor Callahan moved to add new Chapter 11-Technology Law to the Camillus Municipal Code. Councilor Griffio seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

PUBLIC HEARING #4

Consider amending the Camillus Municipal Code, Chapter 34-Fences, §34.7-Exceptions, the purpose of which is to allow a fence exception for a six foot solid fence in the front yard at 101 Fernpark Drive, TM#029.-07-01.0.

Councilor Griffio explained that this is a corner lot with two front yards, a fence has existed for over 30 years, and the current homeowner is simply looking to replace it with a like fence. He stated the neighbors have been contacted and they have no issues with the exception being granted, and the Code Enforcement office also has no concerns.

Resolution #88

Councilor Callahan moved to close the public hearing. Councilor Griffio seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Resolution #89

Councilor Griffio moved to amend the Camillus Municipal Code, Chapter 34-Fences, §34.7-Exceptions, the purpose of which is to allow a fence exception for a six foot solid fence in the front yard at 101 Fernpark Drive, TM#029.-07-01.0, said fence to start at a point connecting to the midpoint of the eastern side of the residence, then extending 13' easterly to a point, then extending 22' southerly to a point of connection with the driveway. Councilor Flood seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Chief Tom Winn stated that the Camillus Community Coalition on Substance Abuse will be holding its fourth mini-forum on May 5 at the West Genesee High School, with sessions providing Narcan training at 5:30, 6:30, and 7:30 p.m. Those who complete the course will be supplied with a Narcan kit.

SUPERVISOR ANNOUNCEMENTS

Supervisor Coogan expressed her thanks to Hourigan Farms for the added measures taken to mitigate the odors while spreading manure. She also announced the splash pad opening celebration would take place on May 21 at 11:00 a.m. at Camillus Park.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Councilor Griffo moved to approve the minutes of the April 12, 2016 meeting. Councilor Flood seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

NEW BUSINESS

Resolution #90

Supervisor Coogan moved to authorize the purchase of six automated external defibrillators in the amount of \$16,243.59, the amount to be charged to the Special Buildings Reserve account #A00000809 and authorize the Supervisor to sign. Councilor LaFlair seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Resolution #91

Councilor Griffo moved to approve the agreement between the Town of Camillus and Feher Rubbish Removal for containerized trash and recycling services for Shove Park from May 1, 2016 through December 31, 2020 and authorize the Supervisor to sign. Councilor LaFlair seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Resolution #92

Councilor Griffo moved to authorize Barton & Loguidice to prepare the portions of the MS4 Annual Stormwater Report that are required to be completed by the Town, at a cost not to exceed \$2,400.00. Councilor Flood seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

APRIL 26, 2016 REGULAR MEETING

Resolution #93

Councilor Callahan moved to set the date, time, and place as May 24, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. to hold a public hearing at the Camillus Municipal Building to amend resolution #48 dated February 9, 2016 to consider adding playground equipment at Camillus Town Hall to the 2016 Community Development Block Grant Projects. Supervisor Coogan seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Resolution #94

Councilor Callahan moved to approve the contract between the Town of Camillus and Dependable Disposal for containerized trash and recycling at residences, Fairmount Library, and the Camillus Municipal Building from May 1, 2016- December 31, 2020 and authorize the Supervisor to sign. Councilor Flood seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Resolution #95

Councilor Callahan moved to approve the purchase of a compactor for the Town of Camillus Landfill at the cost of \$682,897.00 with half the expense paid by Honeywell and half to be financed by the Town. The motion was seconded by Councilor Flood and unanimously approved.

Resolution #96

Councilor Flood moved to appoint Debra Ancillotti to the position of Provisional Assistant Youth Development Program Leader with a salary increase to be offset by an Onondaga County Youth Bureau grant not to exceed \$6,278.00 effective April 27, 2016. The motion was seconded by Councilor Griffo and unanimously approved.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Joe Flynn, of Friends of Camillus Park, noted that prior to the splash pad ribbon cutting on May 21, there will be a "Trail to Splash Run" featuring 1, 2, & 3 mile run trails. Volunteer assistance will be provided by the Friends of Camillus Park, employees of Longhorn Steakhouse, and the Camillus Police Explorers. He also noted that a volunteer effort on Earth Day, with follow up assistance by the Town employees, left the park looking great.

Councilor LaFlair moved to adjourn the meeting at 7:20 p.m. Councilor Griffo seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.
